a. Financial Update - Sheila Harmes

<u>Sheila Harmes:</u> After subtracting out unearned income, the balance for accounts for both April and May is at almost \$52,000.

1) Audit Review

The draft audit is ready for review. Contents of the audit are similar to the previous year except overall year-end balance is lower. Once approved, the auditor will provide the final audit for the next meeting.

On a motion by R. Hall and seconded by S. Jacob, the WWJPB voted to approve the audit. Vote: Yes – All.

2) Proposed 2019 Budget

Wabasha and Winona Counties have sent budget request notifications to the Whitewater JPB. Deadlines were in May and a proposed 2019 budget request was sent by S. Harmes before each deadline (Winona County – May 18, 2018 and Wabasha County – May 31, 2018). The proposed county allocation is the same as last year. The request to Olmsted County will be sent after this Board approves the budget. The proposed budget includes a grant for the Whitewater Farmer-Led Council.

On a motion by R. Hall and seconded by C. Fick, the WWJPB voted to approve the 2019 proposed budget.

b. Stream Restoration in the Driftless and Available Funding – *Jeff Hastings, Trout Unlimited Project Manager*

Jeff Hastings works for Trout Unlimited in Wisconsin. He has had this position for eleven years and previously worked for a conservation district in Wisconsin. The Driftless Area has 600 coldwater streams and over 4000 miles of trout streams. There are 1200 easements with landowners providing access for fishermen. A recent economic study showed that the fishing industry in the Driftless Area brings \$1.6 billion each year to local economies.

Thirteen Trout Unlimited Chapters within the Driftless Area help with stream restoration efforts including stream bank stabilization, removal of box elder and shallow rooted trees, and establishment of nongame wildlife habitat. SE Minnesota projects completed in 2018 include Trout Run, Rush Creek, Cedar River and Garvin Brook. Much of the funding comes from Lessard-Sams Outdoor Heritage Council. In addition to these funds, Trout Unlimited was recently awarded a \$9.2 million Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP) grant for restoring cold-water streams in the Driftless Area. In Minnesota, this will apply to designated trout streams. This grant lasts five years and funding will be available this fall.

c. Rental Agreement/Water Resource Planner office

The rental agreement renewal with Winona County SWCD was tabled from the previous Whitewater JPB meeting. Since that meeting, S. Jacob did communicate with Winona County Administrator about the Whitewater office space. At this time, no alternative proposal is presented from Winona County.

A motion was made by S. Jacob and seconded by R. Hall to approve the existing rental agreement with Winona County SWCD for Whitewater office space and utilities. Voting: Yes – All.

d. 319 Nitrate Reduction Grant

 Both Olmsted SWCD and Winona County SWCD committed in-kind staff support for the Whitewater 319 application. Moving forward with the cover crop incentives that are included in the 319 grant, both SWCDs asked for a sub-agreement giving them approval authority for the cover crop incentives. Once approved, the payments can be made by the Whitewater JPB with 319 grant funds.

1) Winona County SWCD Cover Crop Sub-agreement

A motion was made by S. Jacob and seconded by C. Fick to approve the Winona County SWCD Cover Crop Sub-agreement.

Voting: Yes – All.

2) Olmsted SWCD Cover Crop Sub-agreement

A motion was made by C. Fick and seconded by R. Hall to approve the Olmsted SWCD Cover Crop Sub-agreement.

Voting: Yes - All

e. 319 Small Watershed Project

The federal 319 program in Minnesota has changed. There will no longer be a competitive grant application process. Instead, MPCA will select ten small watersheds and comprehensively address all impairments for 16 years (four funding cycles). S. Harmes provided a map showing the ten small watersheds for the Whitewater Watershed. Also provided, was a letter of interest submitted by S. Harmes on behalf of the Whitewater JPB on June 15, 2018.

f. Forest Action Plan Update

Progress continues on the Forest Action Plan project. In discussions with The Nature Conservancy, the grant end date needs to be extended from December 31, 2018 until late 2019 in order to complete work under the project.

7. Public Comments

Barton Winter wanted to bring to the Board's attention his concerns about the Whitewater River North Branch. This part of the Whitewater is more often turbid; this is impacting fishing and recreation.

8. Agency Reports

Daryl Buck informed the Board that Winona County SWCD is celebrating its 80th Anniversary on August 14th at Farmer's Park. The event includes a tour and dinner.

Justin Watkins commented on the benefits of the new 319 Small Watersheds program. He also concurred that Barton Winter's observations are correct. More study is needed to determine cause of high turbidity in this stream.

9. Next Meeting: The next scheduled meeting is August 16, 2018 at Whitewater State Park.

The Whitewater Joint Powers Board adjourned at 10:50 a.m. on a motion of R. Hall and seconded by C. Fick. Vote: Yes - All
