b. 2023 CWF Grant Application

August 22, 2022 is the deadline for the next funding cycle of the Clean Water Fund grants. Sheila Harmes prepared a resolution to be signed for approving the Whitewater to be able to apply for a grant under a Projects and Practices category; 20% of these funds are directed to clean drinking water. The application will include funding for sealing abandoned wells. Similar projects have included 75%, with a \$1500 cap. This application will have a higher cap (\$3,000) to cover increased costs.

On motion by Bob Walkes and seconded by Mike Flynn, the Whitewater Joint Powers Board voted to approve the 2023 CMF grant application. Vote: Yes – All.

c. 319 Nitrogen Reduction Grant Update

This grant is coming to a close at the end of September 2022. There's about \$12,000 of unused funds for cover crop payments. These funds as well as educational funds can be used to help farmers with educational initiatives.

Riverland Community College has an individualized one-on-one program where they will meet with each farmer to discuss their needs, whether it be cash flow management, market analysis, entrepreneurship, etc. The idea is to utilize the grant to pay a portion of the tuition costs, which vary based on farm size – anywhere from \$2000-\$2500. If those that are interested are enrolled by mid-September, grant funds can be used to assist with cost. A final payment form the grant needs to be made before September 23rd to be able to have it paid under the grant (September 30, 2022 end date). Whitewater Joint Powers Board discussed the benefits of cover crops and results/findings provided to the public. Additionally, the board discussed the logistics of the grant request by Sheila Harmes and other educational options for the grant.

On motion by Mike Flynn and seconded by James Rentz, the Whitewater Joint Powers Board voted to approve a check for up to \$30,000 to be used to assist with tuition costs at Riverland Community College for farmers who enroll in the personalized plan.

Vote: Yes – All.

d. Update on WinLaC planning process

At the August 8, 2022 meeting, the Policy Committee approved a draft plan for internal review. It is being reviewed by the Policy Committee, the Planning Work Group and the Advisory Committee members. In early October, the 60-day public review will begin. Priority issues were identified through input from the public, from the policy committee and from the advisory committee. The 34 priority issues were broken down and grouped with a timeframe of when they will be addressed during the ten-year timeline. Goals were developed for each priority issue. WJPB members received copies of the priorities and goals for the Whitewater planning region are the Action Table was explained. Additionally, the cost-benefit analysis for the implemented practices were explained. Any suggested changes should be given to Sheila Harmes to bring to the advisory committee. The board discussed the different priority areas and the availability of funds for each.

e. Local Advisory Team (MDA) grant update

Dawn Bernau and Mike Cruse are conducting a dealership survey to connect with ag partners within the DWSMAs, to find people willing to be on the advisory committee. Meetings are anticipated to start the end of November or the first week of December.
